



WFOHD sends Engineer, David Russo, to Uganda



Mr Russo took his 3 weeks vacation from his position as a R&D engineer at Seimans to lend his experience to the agricultural school of Nserester Complex in Uganda.

Nserester Complex is an orphanage and school founded by Dr Isaac Nserester, orphaned himself at the age of 9. Today Dr Nserester is a leader of education in Uganda and an advocate for orphans and widows. Nserester complex manages to care for 814 orphans directly through donations and child sponsors from friends in Scotland, Sweden and now, through WFOHD, the USA.



Teens for the Future, WFOHD's The Youth Project pilot group, identified Ugandan orphans as a group of children in need that most people don't know very much about. Teens for the Future (TFTF) began service projects to help the orphans. First, they collected school supplies to go to 1000 Darfur refugee children. Then they sent a nurse to provide medical care to 6000 orphans. After many smaller projects TFTF sponsored David Russo to take water filtration systems to Nserester Complex and to design an irrigation system that would allow the orphanage to produce an addition 20% of their food needs. Mr Russo made connections to many NGO's and private industries in Uganda that could help Nserester Complex do its great work.
